DIGITAL FIFE ONLINE LEARNING



Online learning means using computers instead of books or teachers to learn about a subject. For community groups the courses cover topics such as marketing, working with volunteers and fundraising.



For individuals the courses cover computing and making the most of the internet. Follow the instructions below to use the courses.

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Getting started

1. In Internet Explorer or Firefox type: www.digitalfife.com

2. Click the menu link to "Free courses"

Logging in

- Select one of the modules (e.g. "Consultation") and click "run"
- 4. If you have already registered for online learning, enter your name and password on the next screen.
- 5. If not, press the "Apply" button. You will be asked some questions.
- If you have forgotten your log in click the link to be reminded by email.

Launch a module

- 7. Once you have logged in, your module will run.
- Click Start" to begin learning or select a section if you just want to look up some information.
- 9. The first page appears. You can press "Show" to show more than one item at a time. You can also Press "Listen" to hear the page spoken.

Questions

- 10. Moving on to the next page may bring up a multiple-choice question.
- 11. Answering this correctly makes an entry in your learning log. You can ask for a hint to help you.

- 12. Click "Learning log" on the menu
- 13. You can edit your contact information, look at what you have achieved and see what is left to do.

Certificate of achievement

- 14. Finally you can create a certificate of achievement, listing all the sections of the module that you have studied and passed.
- 15. This can be printed on a colour printer, trimmed, mounted and displayed.
