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CRIMES / INCIDENTS

Crimes recorded between 29/06/2026 and 24/07/2026

A total of 37 crimes were recorded on the West Fife and Coastal Villages area in the time frame detailed above.

The crimes have been grouped into police subdivisions (details below) to allow us to provide some detail whilst preserving confidentiality.

1A – There were 17 crimes recorded including Road Traffic Offences, Threatening and Abusive Behaviour, Assault, Vandalism and Theft by shoplifting.

1B – There were 12 crimes recorded including Road Traffic Offences, Assaults, Threatening and Abusive Behaviour and Fraud.

1C – There were 8 crimes recorded including Road Traffic Offences and Threatening and Abusive Behaviour.

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COMMUNITY WARD UPDATE

In the last month PCs Cooper and Patience have been on patrol in the Ward 1 area, and engaged with members of the community and third party agencies as detailed below:

PCs Cooper and Patience attended Saline and Steelend Community Council meeting. Information was provided at that time in relation to questions about starting a Community Speed Watch initiative. An e-mail containing the same information was then sent out to all Community Councils to gauge interest in the scheme.

PCs Cooper and Patience engaged with third party agencies including Fife Social Work and Housing associations and carried out joint visits with both in an effort to address ongoing issues/concerns.

At the request of Fife Forum, PCs Cooper and Patience attended at the Oakley Retirement Community and gave a talk covering various issues including local concerns, fraud prevention and house security advice. The residents engaged well and there was a discussion about issues raised locally and how these could be addressed.

PCs Cooper and Patience participated in a West Fife Police Off-road Bike Initiative aimed at targeting the illegal use of offroad bikes in the West Fife area. This included resources from across the West Fife area.

PCs Cooper and Patience have assisted in promoting the “It’ll cost you” campaign targeting the illegal purchase of alcohol for underage persons. This included visits to various off-license premises and distribution of posters and other materials.
