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CRIMES / INCIDENTS

Crimes recorded between 25/05/2026 and 28/06/2026

A total of 85 crimes were recorded on the West Fife and Coastal Villages area in the time frame detailed above.

The crimes have been grouped into police subdivisions (details below) to allow us to provide some detail whilst preserving confidentiality.

1A – There were 28 crimes recorded including Road Traffic Offences, Threatening and Abusive Behaviour, Assault, Vandalism, Theft and a Hate Crime.

1B – There were 39 crimes recorded including Road Traffic Offences, Assaults, Threatening and Abusive Behaviour, Vandalism, Failing to comply with Bail, Drug offences, Fraud and Thefts.

1C – There were 18 crimes recorded including Road Traffic Offences, Assaults and Threatening and Abusive Behaviour.

Reviewing the crimes for this month, the only crime of note is that there was an instance of hateful slogans being spray painted on a wall in the Low Valleyfield area. Enquiries are ongoing in relation to this.

1B – Carnock, Gowkhall, Oakley, Comrie, Blairhall, Saline and Steelend

1C – Pattiesmuir, Limekilns, Charlestown, Crombie and Cairneyhill
