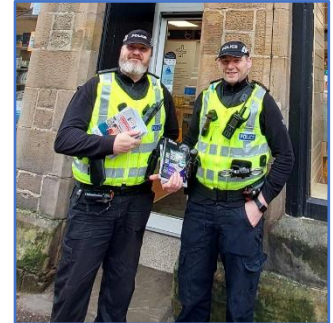

### FESTIVE DRINK / DRUG DRIVE CAMPAIGN 2025



Police officers will be working with communities and patrolling roads across Scotland as the festive period brings a focus to preventing drink and drug driving.

This year's campaign will run from Monday 1st December to Sunday 4th January.

The campaign reinforces the message that 'the best approach is none', reminding motorists that even if you're slightly over the limit, in the eyes of the law you are a drunk-driver and a criminal.

We urge people to plan ahead during the party season, to think about how you get home and about the impact alcohol can still have the morning after. The consequences of drink-driving can be devastating and there will be resources on patrol during the festive period to discourage anyone thinking about it. The best advice is don't risk it, don't drink and drive.

Local Community Officers will be working alongside Road Police Officers during this festive period on this campaign.

### ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR (ASB)

PC's Cook and Wallace continue to carry out increased patrols in the local area over the weekends and holidays, anti-social behaviour degrades a community's quality of life by creating feelings of fear and insecurity, damaging mental and physical health and weakening trust in local institutions and neighbours; if you are experiencing ASB in your local area then please get in touch.
