

**COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENTS**

Local community officers recently paid visits to Crail Nursery and Canongate Primary School whose pupils were learning about “people who help us”.

Officers very much enjoyed their engagement with the children & staff and equally the pupils were as positive with the visit undertaken, asking numerous questions and keeping the officers on their toes. This included officers visiting the additional support class, on the same day.



Engaging with schools and educational settings is a priority and cornerstone of community policing, with further engagements pencilled in over the coming weeks and months.



On 18<sup>th</sup> October, PC Cook attended an African art pop-up exhibition and family open day hosted by the Cupar Arts, Fife African Caribbean Network, and Culture Heritage and Arts Assembly, Argyll and Isles (CHARTS) which featured African artworks from the Argyll Collection.

Artworks were on display from Uganda, Tanzania, Zambia, Kenya and South Africa, bought in the 1960s and 1970s for the children of Argyll.

Today these artworks are part of the Argyll Collection, a pioneering local authority educational art collection owned by Argyll

and Bute Council and managed by CHARTS, with support from Creative Scotland.

The exhibition formed part of Black History Month Scotland, this cluster is in Fife, providing the opportunity to get up close with internationally significant artworks by artists like Jak Katarikawe (Uganda), Henry Tayali (Zambia) and Lucky Sibiya (South Africa). The day provided an opportunity to learn about Tingatinga paintings, Ugandan prints from the era of independence, art inspired by the “Zulu Macbeth,” and creative fun led by the poet, Tawona Sitholé.
