5. MATTERS ARISING FROM MINUTES:

- NEWPORT PRIMARY SAFETY: Newport P7 pupils will produce posters which will be ready for new term. Speed limits and kerb parking will be implemented at this time.
- PROPOSED ROAD BUILD OUTS Tay Street, West Road and Kilmany Road: Cllr Tepp and Rick D to have conversation with Nigel Hampton, Lead Officer of Roads Dept. In addition a request will be made for a discussion on site of the positioning of the build outs planned. Stephen R suggested asking for temporary fixtures to be implemented in order to test the efficiency of the plan and avoid unnecessary costs pending later adjustments

- FORGAN ROUNDABOUT: No movement yet re adjustments to the capacity and visibility of the bus stop area. Cllr LKD remarked on the overgrown greenery which impacts on visibility. She will put in a request for cropping.
- DRUMOIG COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH: Residents still would like some form of face to face meeting around why they cannot operate as trained on the main road(A914).

6. TOPICAL ISSUES - COUNCILLORS REPORTS:

CLLR TEPP circulated his report

- Follow up on speeding in area. Police involved
- Potholes. Council will always judge which ones require permanent repairs.
- Update on park furniture
- Local Development plan is in the early stages of development and on completion is set for 10 to 20 years ahead.
- Poor parking on Boat Brae impacting on residents.
- Fly tipping at recycling points an issue.
- EV ducting at Persimmon site is still absent. Planning application re submitted.
- Vaping at Madras College amongst pupils is a growing concern. Regular toilet monitoring is in place according to rector.

Cllr LKD

- reported that reaction to Forgan Roundabout issue is slow but cropping of vegetation to be requested, RD and LKD to meet and discuss.

 ACTION – RD and Clir LK-D
- There will be a costing exercise into reflective bollards at Forgan Roundabout.
- Parents concerned about lack of seatbelts in school buses. There is no law requiring them but the death of a child in the South has highlighted the issue.
- The fly tipping issue at the recycling points and overflowing bins relates in part to height challenged people who cannot access top of bins.
- Waterstone Crook membership has increased in number
- Efforts are being made to increase uptake of CAFÉING. Wormit will continue to
 provide free lunches during the summer holidays. Leuchars runs an after-school club
 also. Parents are expected to transport children to the facilities.

7. PLANNING MATTERS:

SR reported that in the last 4 weeks ,3 applications had been submitted all minor. The Fourth was an application to demolish the farm cottages at Newton in order to enable the building of new accommodation...possibly for employees.

AG reported that the planning objections to the Sauna are now available to view online. SR. Suggested that there should be some recourse through an insurance claim for the destruction of the bus stop on the High Street. Cllr Tepp to enquire. **ACTION – Cllr Tepp**
